

New Parking Lot Management System

Yuma International Airport replaced the parking lot management system with updated, fully automated equipment utilizing as much of the current infrastructure as possible in an effort to keep parking costs to a minimum.

The new system is also integrated with Parkonect, allowing guests to use their favorite parking pay application from their Android or iOS device common at most airports throughout the world.

The new system includes 2 fully automated exit lanes that accept debit and credit card payments to exit the parking lot. There is a pay kiosk located in the baggage claim area accepts cash, debit and credit cards. Two cashier stations are conveniently located in the Administration department on the second floor, and the Operations department across from TSA screening for validation or payment. Brewers Restaurant and Sports Bar will validate their patrons' parking.

The new parking management system solution also includes intercom communication for real time connectivity between airport guests and the airport's duty phone to communicate and resolve any issues.

The airport is happy to keep the same rates that are among the lowest in the country:

0-15 minutes – Free 16-30 minutes - \$1.00 31-60 minutes - \$2.00 Each additional hour - \$2.00 Daily Maximum - \$8.00

H. L. Suverkrup Students Talk with Astronauts & Learn About Space

Congratulations to the students and staff from H.L. Suverkrup Elementary School who earned the opportunity to speak live with Expedition 55 astronauts Scott Tingle of NASA and Norishige Kanai of the Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency who are living and working aboard the International Space Station.

The students posed questions directly to astronauts about life aboard the space station, NASA's deep space exploration plans, and doing science in space. The students and their teachers prepared for the event by studying the space station, astronaut biographies, and the current research and activities happening aboard the station. In addition, the Suverkrup students' names have been inscribed on a microchip to be carried around on the lander as it travels the surface of Mars, and the students are preparing for a virtual field trip to the Red Planet. Members from NASA's Capsule Parachute Assembly System who test the parachutes at Yuma Proving Grounds spoke with the students the week before and brought with them several inspirational posters to spur their curiosity about future career paths.

These in-flight education downlinks are an integral component of NASA's Year of Education on Station, which provides extensive space station-related resources and opportunities to students and educators. Linking students directly to astronauts aboard the space station provides unique, authentic experiences designed to enhance student learning, performance and interest in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM).
