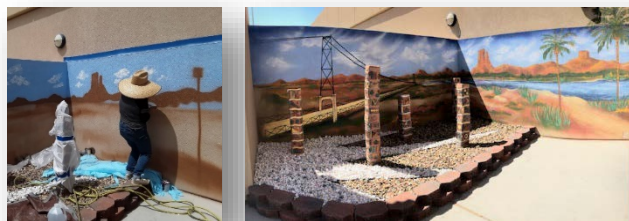

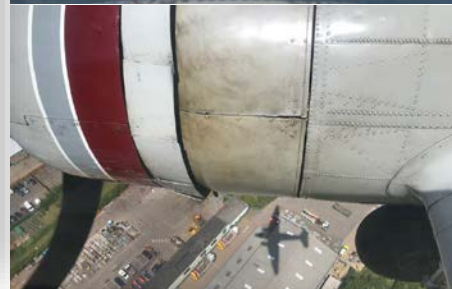
AVIATION AROUND TOWN

Yuma Aviator's Trip to Normandy France

Joe and Annie Fisher proudly participated in the 75th Anniversary of the D-Day Landings in Normandy France. Joe Fisher has been involved with the Flabob Express, a vintage DC3, for over five years as a crew member and has been a major contributor with his time and skills as a pilot and mechanic. The Flabob Express was contacted by Daks over Normandy, along with other DC3's/C47 organizations with an invitation to participate in the 75th anniversary of D-Day. Upon receipt of the invitation, the "Flabob Express" and her crew worked constantly to make her ready for the epic journey.

The Flabob Express joined four C-47's and a T6 to fly over our Nations most restricted airspace over the Memorial Day weekend. The mission was for World War II vintage aircraft to fly over Washington D.C. in honor of the 75th anniversary of D-Day. The flyover was conducted by members of the D-Day Squadron, part of the non-profit group the Tunison Foundation. D-Day Squadron works to maintain and educate the public about not only the aircraft that flew during World War II but the pilots as well.

15 American DC3/C-47s, including Joe Fisher and the Flabob Express, flew from the United States to Normandy to commemorate the 75th anniversary of D-Day on June 6th. After that, the group made their way to Berlin in remembrance of the Berlin Airlift on June 17th.

On August 18th, 1929, twenty women pilots entered the first official women-only air race in the United States from Santa Monica, CA to Cleveland, OH. The stop in Yuma, Arizona was requested by all of the participating aviatrixes.

To commemorate the 90th anniversary of this historic event, Yuma International Airport is hosting a Fly-In and will conduct a ribbon cutting of a new mural celebrating the aviatrixes. Guests are invited to tour the Yuma History & Aviation Museum and buffet at the Yuma Landing.
